
Why Should Correctional Health Care Matter to You? How to Use a New RFP Toolkit to Improve Outcomes



This is a **medically complex population** with higher rates of diseases, mental illness, substance use, trauma, brain injury, and other disabilities than the general population.



Unmet health & behavioral health needs may contribute to criminal justice system involvement.

Most jails and prisons outsource care using an RFP (solicitation for bids) as a blueprint for the contract.

The detail and accuracy of the RFP and the process for selecting a vendor are critical to the long-term success of the healthcare program.



## **Potential Benefits of Improving Healthcare Contracts:**

- Provide better medical, mental health, & substance use care in facilities 1
- Increase safety & decrease lawsuits due to medical negligence 2
- Reduce preventable & facility-attributable deaths 3
- 4 Enhance cost efficiencies through clear expectations to potential vendors
- 5 Improve **provider accountability** through performance measure and outcomes
- 6 Increase medication consistency & connection to community-based care
- 7 Reduce unnecessary & costly post-release health services such as ER use
- 8 Decrease risk of drug overdoses
- 9 Reduce racial disparities in public health & access to care
- 10 Reduce potential re-cycling through the CJS due to unmet health needs
